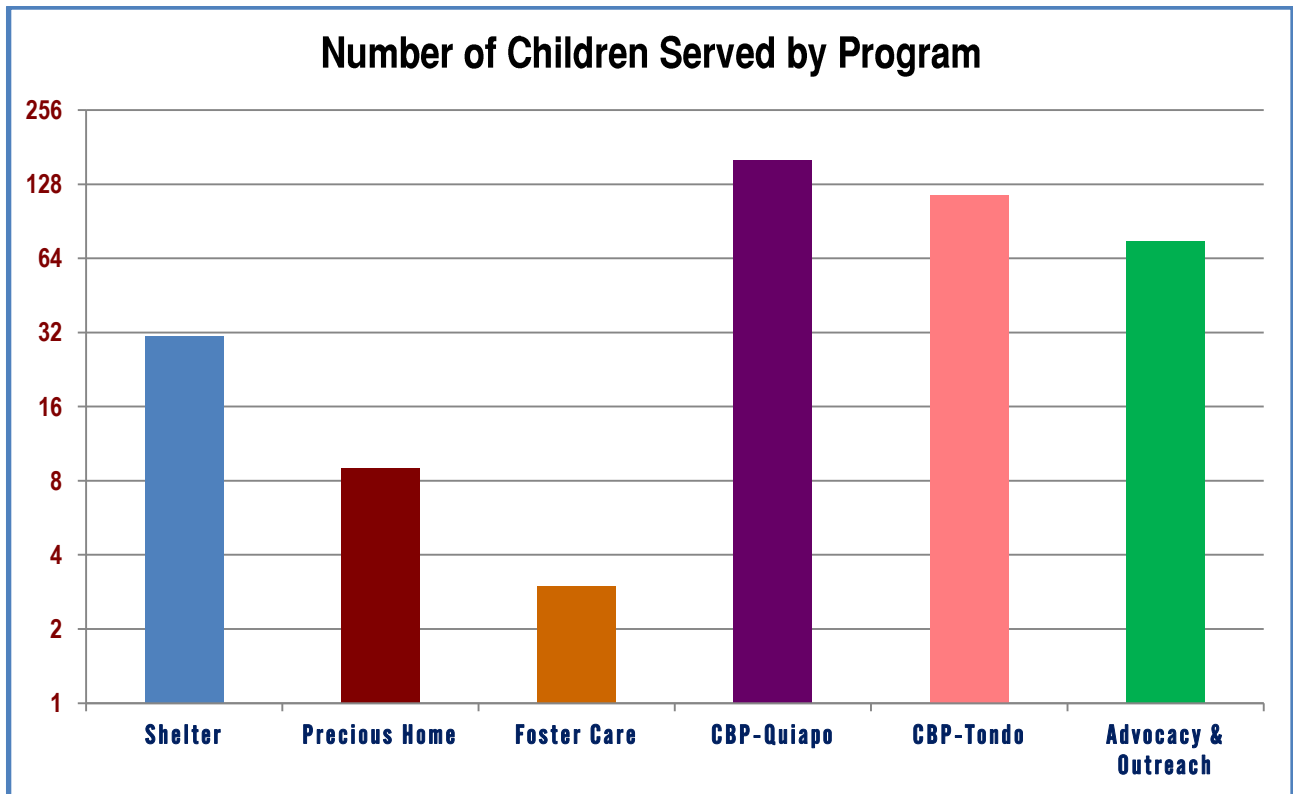
We promote and practice education that takes into consideration the child's nature, preferences, and capacity and aims at developing the child's full potential.

# the year at a glance



Onesimo Bulilit has served a total of **393 children at risk** and their **families** through its various programs and services, and with the support of donors and ministry partners.

In October 22-23, 2017 and November 7-8, 2017, 90 families and a total of 498 participants participated in a Family Retreat in Jabez Campsite, Cavite.

Two Summer Camps at Camp Rock, Mindoro were attended by 62 children and 29 leaders and junior leaders.

On October 13-14, 2017, 6 Board of Trustees and 10 staff participated the Strategic Planning in International Teams Mission's House, Quezon City.





# residential care

Children (6-10 years old) in need of temporary shelter, nurture, attention and special protection from abuse and neglect are admitted to residential care. While in the shelter, the children experience a home-like atmosphere, are sent to school, learn adaptive life skills, and grow in an environment that provides positive experiences and opportunities for their growth and development.

- Thirty (31) children served with nurture, love, care and attention, other services and activities.
- Fifteen (15) children admitted, and 10 were reconciled to their families.
- Fifteen (15) children enrolled in formal school.
- These children received academic awards and honor.
- One (1) child promoted to Grade 7.
- 1 Child (boy) joined his Christian adoptive family in USA after 5 years at shelter.

## Testimony of Kimberly Pimentel

I'm Kimberly Pimentel, I was only 11 years old when I came to Onesimo Bulilit Foundation and now I am already 15 years old. When a neighbor witnessed that my mother slapped me, she reported it to the Department of Social Welfare (DSWD) and I was brought to DSWD-Makati. Since then, I never saw my mother again. I felt so blessed and happy when I came to Onesimo Bulilit because I was given the opportunity to enrol in school. It was my first time to attend school because my mother never sent me to school. I also experienced to have a comfortable life. I have my own bed, they provided me nice clothes, I never skip my meals again and I experienced to go to different beautiful places like Puerto Galera and Baguio. I would like to thank God for all of these. I also would like to thank the House Parents and staff who never give up caring for me despite of my behavior. They always forgive me and give me another chance when I commit mistakes. Sometimes I have lost my hope that I can have my own family because of my age. But my Social Worker always tells me to never stop praying and to keep on believing in God that someday I can be placed in a family that can give me true love, protect me, provide all my needs and that never hurts and leaves me again. I am still hoping that someday I can meet my biological mother again. But I also know God has a good plan for me.

# precious home

Children (10-15 years old) in need of special protection from abuse are admitted to precious home. While in the precious home, the children are healed from painful experiences and are safe and growing in an environment that provides opportunities for mental, emotional, social and spiritual wholeness.

- Served 9 children; all girls.
- Disseminated this program to ministry partners and networks for referrals and slots for admission.
- Inaugurated the Precious home in July 11, 2016 with Mgnt. team, Board, staff and children. Pastor BG facilitated the house blessing with prayer for the residents.
- 2 children enrolled in formal school, and 1 in Alternative Learning System (ALS)
- 2 children promoted to Grade 1 and Grade 7.
- Presently, 7 children in care.





# story of transformation

I started in a complete and a happy family however it was not always happy. We had a family problem that even my parents had no solutions. That was the time where we had to stay on the sidewalks. It was hard at first but through the time I got used to it. Still it was difficult especially when it rains we do not have any place to go. We all got wet as well as our things. It is very difficult to live in times like this. Sometimes we do not have food to eat. There are times that we eat two times a day. We have to go to other barangay/place just to take a bath and to get a drinking water.

There was a day that a man invited us to a foundation. We never knew him and I am afraid that time because there are rumours that there are people kidnapping children. We are afraid but we went to that foundation, which is the Onesimo Bulilit Foundation.

When I got there I noticed that there are a lot of children. Some are taking a bath, some are doing their assignments and some are taught with their assignments. Since then, I visit the place every day. Most of all I got to know God. Yes I know Him but this is the time that I got to live His words and the things I learn about Him.

I was transferred in the residential care of Onesimo. I was amazed with the big house it is like a mansion. I ate delicious foods and I was able to have new clothes. I am happy that time because my mother can only but me one clothes. I am happy also because I was able to go to other places.

Currently, I am now in Precious Home. I love the place because it is quiet and the house is beautiful. I am still studying as Grade 10 student. Here I got to experience to be an older sister to the younger children. It is difficult because you have to have greater patience. I am very thankful to where I am right now. I also thank God for all the people He used for me like the social workers, house parents and other staffs of Onesimo. I also want to thank God because of the beautiful things that are happening in my life right now. Now, I will continue to rise and continue my dreams and I will never forget the help of God and Onesimo in my life.

## Testimony of Aileen

I am Aileen, a Grade 10 student. When I was child my father died due to heart illness. We lost our source of income and became poor, so we transferred to Manila. At my young age, I roamed around in the streets to beg because my mother has no work. I was the only one who was left in the custody of my mother. My other siblings were adopted due to her incapability of taking care to us. I never saw my other siblings again, and my mother also died. My friends brought me to the Onesimo Bulilit Drop-in Center. Later I was admitted to the residential center and here my needs were provided. I learned to be a good example and teach the younger children good character. I was able to join the camps and also became assistant facilitator and taught the children about God's creation. When I got older, I was placed in a foster family, the Wartenweiler family, who made me feel that I am part of their family. They taught me how to be content, and the value of family. They supported my needs and they were always there for me when I had my problems. I am so thankful for the love they shared with me. Recently, I was transferred to the new foster family that will guide me and take care of me. I am also happy with them, they are kind to me.

I just want to thank all the people who love me and who helped me. And to the other kids: we should not give up our dreams and study hard to be able to reach them!

## Testimony of Jennifer Verano

Good life to all of you!

I am a Social Worker of Foster Care in Onesimo Bulilit. I have been with the Bulilit family for 1 year and 9 months. In this short time, I have been facing challenges and at the same time I have gained new learnings. It is not an easy task to recruit foster families who are willing to foster a child who is not their own. We find it difficult to foster our own relatives, what more with other children who are not related to us at all. But I believed that God has a plan for these children. God knows how much these children are longing for the love and care of a family and I believed that He will never fail his children.

I was also temporarily became the Social Worker of Precious Home, a new program of Onesimo Bulilit. Here I learned and experienced lot of things. # community-based program quiapo

The Child Sponsorship Program (CSP) supports street children (7-18 years old) in their formal schooling, develops their potential and helps them to reach their dreams. Their educational needs such as school supplies, uniforms, and allowances have been provided. The Student Center has offers a safe and friendly environment for tutorials, skills enhancement and empowerment. The parents are encouraged to participate in the program and are supported in their child rearing responsibilities.

- One hundred sixty (160) Children served through Educational Assistance and Child Support Service.
- Distributed complete sets of uniforms, bags and school supplies to all the children before the opening of school year.
- Conducted a general assembly and consultation meeting with 65 parents of children on August 11, 2016.
- Conducted 3 Kids workshops and Educational Fieldtrip to children in the program.

# community-based program tondo

Street children (6-14 years old), after being reached out in the streets, find a safe place, a refuge, and an open ear in the Drop-in Center. While at the center, the children are provided with meals and snacks, their values and behaviours are addressed through various workshops and activities, and they learn basic literacy skills. Also, their situation is being assessed and appropriate interventions are given.

The Child Sponsorship Program (CSP) supports street children (7-25 years old) in their formal schooling, develops their potential and helps them to reach their dreams. Their educational needs such as school supplies, uniforms, and allowances have been provided. The Student Center has offers a safe and friendly environment for tutorials, skills enhancement and empowerment. The parents are encouraged to participate in the program and are supported in their child rearing responsibilities.

Onesimo Bulilit Foundation instituting the College Educational Assistance Program is committed to provide the following services and assistance to former and qualified students through the following implementing scheme and structure.

- One hundred fifteen (115) children were served through Drop-In Center, Educational Assistance and Child Support Service.
- The Student Center in Tondo moved to its new rent building on March 20, 2017 at Mabuhay, Tondo, Manila.
- Twenty four (24) families participated in the Family outing on April 11, 2017 at Balagtas Bulacan.
- 35 street children served by Drop-in Center.

By the way, I'm Ian D. Cabriles, a former Social Worker in Drop-In Center but now I was transferred in Quiapo, since the Drop-in is closed from now. I would like to share my testimony about my experience here in Onesimo Bulilit. During my first day of my work, I don't know what is going to happen? Or what might happen to me, since I'm a new one here in Manila. But it doesn't matter because my only goal is to work with other people and it is my passion of work. Like I said I'm a new one and I think it's so hard for me to adjust the environment. Later on, as I observe the children and what the foundation help them. I was inspired by it because the foundation has a big impact to them; from the street they teach them the proper hygiene and become a responsible child. How to obey other people and even cared of the unconditioned love of being a parent to those children who are neglect and abandoned. They also teach what the rights of being a child are. They encouraged many children to become a good leader and enhance their skills for teaching the community. # psychology department

Children admitted to OBFi programs can avail the services of the Psychology department especially children in Precious Home, Residential Care Program and other children with urgent need for intervention or assessment.

The goal is, children's psychological and emotional well-being has been improved and they are empowered for their lives outside of the center.

- 32 children served through a series of individual counseling and 6 groups for group therapy
- Attended court case for 1 child in the program as an expert witness.
- Recruited 5 practicumers and 1 volunteers



# advocacy and outreach

Street children and out of school youth (7-16 years old) in the community of Quiapo and Tondo. The goals are to provide combination of services that contributes to the attainment of the helping goals for the beneficiaries. Developed child rights advocates and young leaders who are active agents of transformation in their families, schools, and community. Supported children at risk within their families, and all efforts done to empower and equip the families to care for their own children.

- 75 Children served by Outreach program.
- The team goes to the streets weekly to build relationship with the children who are there and encourage them through games, songs, Bible stories and counseling.





# crisis intervention

Crisis Intervention program is an action center of Onesimo Bulilit to give timely and immediately responds to walk-in individuals and families in desperate situations of crisis. It provides integrated services such as immediate rescue and protection; provision of financial and material assistance; referrals for medical, psychological and other services to clients.

➤ 65 walked-in clients were given immediate interventions such as medical, burial and transportation assistance.



## special events

- ▶ 259 beneficiaries attended and enjoyed the Kids General Christmas Party last December 13, 2016. The highlights of the activity were gift-giving, fellowships and games.
- ▶ 2 Batches of Family Retreat was conducted in October 22-23, and November 7-8, 2017 at Jabez Campsite, Cavite with 90 families and a total 498 participants.
- ▶ A 5-day summer vacation camp with Shelter and Foster kids was held last May 1-6, 2017 at Camp Rock, Puerto Galera, Oriental, Mindoro. This activity was a joint effort done by shelter and Foster care.





# program management

- Conducted the Annual Program and Admin Evaluation and Planning on April 18-21, 2017 at CDC, Tagaytay City.
- Prior to the said activity, a pre-evaluation and planning was facilitated by E.D. to all programs and admin department.



# administrative

- Annual Audit held last July 4-7, 2016.

- Hired 3 Social Workers and 2 House parents for the programs.
- Conducted quarterly orientations to all staff and volunteers about policies and procedures of admin, finance and personnel.
- Onesimo Bulilit is now enrolled with BPI ExpressLink for Pag-Ibig payments and payroll.
- OBFI celebrated its 12<sup>th</sup> Foundation day last December 10, 2016 at Roof deck with special presentation of Theater group.
- This special event was attended by our beneficiaries, Board of Trustees, some representatives from the general memberships, guests, staff and volunteers.
- Accommodated 4 Volunteers/Interns from Switzerland, Germany and Denmark.
- Conducted a despedida party for Daniel and his family on April 24, 2017 with the participation children, former OBFI clients, Ate Sol, and staff and volunteers.

- Signed MOA with DSWD-NCR last February 6, 2017 for MCCT Program.
- In collaboration with Cherry Mobile Philippines, a total of 83 beneficiaries were served last January 7, 2017 through the Cherry Hears Caravan..
- Distributed 200 Brochures to nearby communities and establishments.
